## Disney Pledges Dignified Abe For Fair Entry

**SPRINGFIELD, Ill. (AP)**—Any Illinoisans who may be worried about the dignity of an animated Abraham Lincoln figure at the 1964 New York World's Fair were reassured Tuesday by its creator, Walt Disney.

"I have more at stake than the state of Illinois. I'm staking my reputation this will be a dignified—not a carnival—presentation," he said at a luncheon marking the centennial of the Gettysburg Address.

Officials were permitted to hear—but not peek at—the twangy-voiced Lincoln which designers expect to attract a steady stream of visitors to the Illinois Pavilion.

The figure will sit, rise, talk and gesture to audiences of 500 at a time in the theater which will be the main attraction of the million dollar Illinois exhibit.

Will Burtin, designer of the Illinois Pavilion at the fair, said it was designed to handle "an expected avalanche of visitors."

# City To Mark Centennial Of Gettysburg Address

Springfield will be host to two national figures Tuesday as the city marks the 100th anniversary of Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address with a civic luncheon at the Elks Club.

Walt Disney, movie maker and developer of the famous Disneyland amusement park, and Robert Moses, a New York planner and builder who is serving as president of the 1964-65 New York World's Fair, will be featured guests at the luncheon.

They will share the spotlight with Gov. Otto Kerner and members of the Illinois Commission on the New York World's Fair, headed by Lincoln Historian Ralph G. Newman and Judge James B. Parsons of Chicago.

The luncheon will serve not only to commemorate the centennial of the Gettysburg Address but also as the first ma-

mission on the World's Fair, will precede the noon luncheon.

Disney is scheduled to come to Springfield in his private plane, stopping in Chicago to pick up Moses, who will have flown there from New York. The party is due to arrive at Capital Airport about 10:30 a.m.

Disney is creator of the "Great Moments with Mr. Lincoln" presentation which will be a continuing attraction at the Illinois Pavilion at the fair.

Also attending the luncheon will be most state elected officials or their representatives, city and county officials, and representatives of the architectural firm of Skidmore, Owings & Merrill, designers of the Illinois Pavilion.

Abe Roberts, general chairman of the civil luncheon committee, said tickets for the event were all sold by last Friday.
