Dear Mr. Belasco:

We do indeed have a copy of the letter addressed to you by Mr. Cassin, and are in the process of detailing the enclosure for the Gettysburg Address.

The plan is to build a marble enclosure to completely cover the safe. The enclosure will have hinged doors corresponding to those on the safe. We have the dimensions on your catalog sheet, but would appreciate your confirming the height, depth, and length of the safe including the handles which appear to project. We would not be using the wheels or kick board, and we are desirous of getting down to a minimum height which we understand would be 41".

Our requirements are for only one shelf within the safe and this should be about 17" from the floor.

Regarding delivery, we will be installing material on April 1st, and this would seem to be a good target date for delivery. The safe should be consigned to George A. Fuller Construction Company, Mr. Peter Dejongh, Illinois Pavilion, New York World's Fair, Flushing, New York.
