NEW YORK WORLD'S FAIR
FEDERAL AND STATES EXHIBITS

Federal -

The \$17,000,000 Federal Pavilion has as its theme "Challenge to Greatness". Cinerama has a contract to design and operate second floor combination film and three-dimensional exhibit illustrating the "pioneer spirit of America, its present and its future".

Alaska -
(\$700,000)

The Alaska Pavilion will be an enlargement of its highly successful Seattle exhibit. The feature show will be a contour map of the state and a reproduction of the aurora borealis effect. There will be additional ground floor exhibits, concessions and a totem pole display.

California -
(\$2,500,000)

The Golden California Pavilion will feature a wine cellar, a citrus exhibit, various city displays, and other California industrial exhibits. There will be a restaurant in the pavilion.

Florida -
(\$3,000,000)

The Fabulous Florida exhibit will contain a 100 foot high citrus tower and exhibit, the first live porpoise show ever seen at a World's Fair, an exhibition hall housing state, county, city and industrial exhibits, and several smaller exhibit halls and models of typical Florida homes.

Hawaii -
(\$3,000,000)

The \$3,500,000 Hawaiian Pavilion will have an "Aloha" theme building housing the islands' historical and cultural exhibits, and industrial exhibits building, a series of shops featuring native Hawaiian products, a native Ula Mau village, a 600 seat open-air amphitheatre for fashion shows, and a Five Volcanoes restaurant featuring island cuisine.

Illinois -

Lincolnia is expected to be the theme of the Illinois Pavilion with Walt Disney's animated figure of the 16th president as the feature attraction.

Indiana -
(\$300,000)
(for bldg.)

The Indiana Pavilion will be constructed largely of Hoosier materials. The exhibit will house various state tourist and industrial displays.

Louisiana -
(\$3,000,000)

The three acre Louisiana Pavilion will feature a reproduction of a portion of the New Orleans Vieux Carrea with restaurants, night clubs and other features. It will also include state and industrial displays, a children's center and a fashion display area.

Maryland -
(\$1,200,000)

Maryland's famous seafood will be featured in the 250 seat second floor restaurant. First level exhibits will include a small theatre where a film presentation of the Battle of Fort McHenry and the writing of the Star Spangled Banner by Francis Scott Key will be shown. General Douglas McArthur will give the prologue to the film.

Minnesota -
(\$400,000)

Outdoor living in Minnesota will be featured including an ice fishing area, an open assembly area and various other outdoor exhibits. The main exhibit hall will house state and industrial exhibits and a restaurant featuring native Minnesota products.

Missouri -
(\$1,000,000)

Missouri's theme will be "First in Air, First in Space". A replica of the plane Charles A. Lindburgh used to cross the Atlantic (Spirit of St. Louis) and of a mercury space capsule will be featured. A simulated rendezvous in space with a gemini space vehicle will also be shown. Outside the main exhibit hall there will be an open-air restaurant seating 250 people.

Montana -
(\$100,000)

Montana's territorial centennial train will travel across the country in April 1964 ending at the Fair for display during the two Fair seasons. The exhibit cars will house indian artifacts, original Remington paintings and other Montana historical displays. Outside the cars there will be indian tepees and ceremonial dancing.

New England States -
(\$3,500,000)

The six New England States have joined in a pavilion. There will be separate information buildings for each state, joint regional and industrial displays, a village green for band concerts and other special events, a country store, a fish hatchery and a 250 seat restaurant featuring New England style foods.

New Jersey -
(\$1,500,000)

New Jersey's 300th anniversary will be celebrated in 1964. Their Tercentenary Pavilion will feature twenty-one open-air pavilions, one for each county in the state, a governor's building, and a central assembly area for special events.

New York City -
(\$2,000,000)

The City of New York will occupy the building remaining from the last Fair. Half of the first level will house a scale model of the City including all of the 840,000 structures within the five boroughs. Fair visitors will view the model from a simulated helicopter ride around the perimeter of the City. An ice extravaganza with 3,000 seats staged by Dick Button with six one-hour performances each day will occupy the other half of the first floor. The balcony will house thirty-four exhibits from the various city museums, zoos, botanical gardens and other cultural institutions.

New York State -
(\$7,000,000)

The one hundred foot high Tent of Tomorrow will form an umbrella for the state departmental exhibits, a huge plastic map of the state and an assembly area, for special meetings, concerts and fashion shows. The highest point in the Fair grounds will be 220 feet above the ground at the top of one of the three New York State observation towers serviced by high speed elevators. The third feature will be a circular theatre seating 600 where a panoramic film of the state's attractions will be shown.

Oklahoma -
(\$300,000)

Oklahoma's water resources will be featured in their landscaped garden exhibit. There will be a waterfall leading into a lake. A large contour map of the state will be erected on the site.

Tennessee -
(\$500,000)

Country music will be featured in the Tennessee Pavilion. The exhibit will also house various state and industrial exhibits.

TEXAS -
(\$2,000,000)

The Texas exhibit will be associated with the 2400 seat century showcase theatre restaurant. There will be a series of open pavilions around the theatre with industrial and tourism displays from the state and a series of restaurants.

West Virginia -
(\$1,250,000)

The "Land of Relaxation's" Pavilion will feature a trip through a coal mine, a view of glass blower creating fine stemware, a radio astronomy sky exhibit and a model of the City of Tomorrow as it will exist in West Virginia.

Wisconsin -
(\$500,000)

The Wisconsin Pavilion will feature the tourist attractions and industrial potential of the state. The cheesemakers will display the largest single piece of cheese in the world.
